COMMUNITY—The community of Lander is located in a valley in the Wind River Mountains. The population is 7,732 with major industries and resources of mining, petroleum, and agriculture. The leading employer in the area is the State of Wyoming.

SCHOOL DISTRICT—The district educational system includes a K-12 program: one K-3 school, one 4-5 school, one 6-8 middle school, one alternative 9-12 school, and one traditional 9-12 high school. The end of the year district population was 1,655 students.

SCHOOL—Lander Valley High School is a four year comprehensive high school with a August 27, 2023 enrollment of 614 students. Native American students make up 19% of the LVHS population. 26% of LVHS students receive free or reduced lunch. Expenditures per ADM for the 2022-23 school year were \$8,599.36.

FACULTY—Of the 46 certified staff, 25 hold a Master's Degree. The student to teacher ratio is 17 to 1, with 33 full-time classroom teachers.

Mean ACT scores. 116 LVHS (2024 graduates) were tested. 6233 Wyoming students were tested.

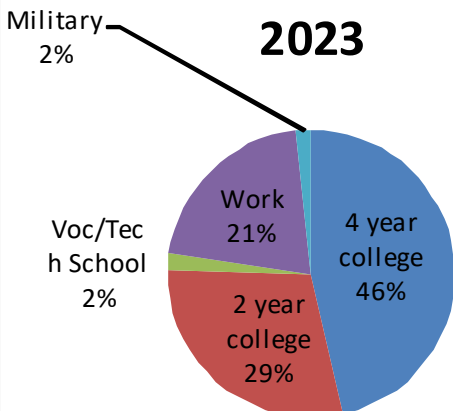
